

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

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**Beste bezoeker,**

Voor de tweede maal heten wij u van harte welkom op Cinedans, het Nederlandse festival voor de dansfilm. Toen we vorig jaar voor het eerst een festival organiseerden rond de dans op het witte doek, koesterden we alleen nog de stilte hoop dat we hier dit jaar opnieuw zouden staan. Dankzij alle enthousiaste filmmakers, dansers, juryleden, medewerkers, partners en – last but not least – toeschouwers beleven we vandaag de tweede editie van Cinedans. Als bijzondere nieuwe partner noemen we Julidans, het somerdansfestival rond het Leidseplein dat ons dit jaar in zijn programmering heeft opgenomen. Het begin van een nieuwe traditie?

Een dag lang staat De Balie in het teken van dans en film. Ruim 25 films, geselecteerd uit 120 inzendingen uit de hele wereld, worden in de grote en kleine zaal vertoond, nog eens 250 films zijn naar keuze te bekijken in een speciaal ingerichte videoruimte. De acht beste inzendingen dingen vandaag mee naar de Cinedans Award, een geldprijs ter waarde van € 1000, die dit jaar voor de tweede keer wordt uitgereikt. Als toeschouwer mag u zelf uw stem uitbrengen op één van de genomineerde films.

Bij de selectie van films zijn we dit jaar nog verder gegaan dan vorig jaar. Originaliteit alleen vonden we niet genoeg; nog meer hebben we gezocht naar films waarin dans en camera een symbiose met elkaar aangaan. Beide kunstvormen hebben hun eigen karakter en stijlregels; de kunst in dansfilm is om beide tot hun recht te laten komen. In een dansfilm zit de dans minder vast aan tijd en ruimte: de dans kan sprongen maken, uit de ban springen. Dat is de kracht van een goede dansfilm maar de valkuil van een slechte. Want zomaar klakkeloos wat mooie bewegingen achter elkaar monteren is bij lange na niet genoeg om het hart van de toeschouwer te vangen. Bij de vele animaties die we binnen kregen hebben we vooral geflet op de vraag: waar wordt de digitale animatiemeland warm? Te vaak houdt animatie de kijker op een verre afstand; de verwondering is daarom des te groter als animatiedekkers erin slagen een digitale wereld werkelijk tot leven te wekken.

Oordeelt u vandaag zelf. Behalve de genomineerde films vertonen we ook de succesvolle documentaire *Damen und Herren ab 65* over de choreografie *Kontakthof* van Pina Bausch. Er is een video-installatie te zien van Susanne Ohmann, Robin Noorda en Ferri Wouters, de Nederlandse choreografe Suzy Blok is Artist in Focus met drie filmvertoningen en een gesprek. De dag wordt toepasselijk afgesloten met een feest in Café De Balie, waar dj's Roberta Marques en Liat Waysbort ervoor zorgen dat ieders voeten van de vloer gaan.

**Dear visitor,**

We would like to welcome you for the second time to Cinedans, the Dutch dance film festival. Last year, when we organized our first festival about dance on screen, we cherished the secret hope that we would be able to be here again this year. And thanks to all the enthusiastic filmmakers, dancers, jury members, collaborators, partners and – last but not least – audience, we are today able to hold the second edition of Cinedans. This year, we have an exceptional new partner in Julidans, the summer festival that takes place around the Leidseplein, who have included us in their programming. The beginning of a new tradition?

For a whole day, De Balie is completely given over to dance and film. Over twentyfive films, selected from 120 entries from all over the world, will be shown in the big and small auditorium and another 250 films can be seen in a specially equipped video room. The eight best entries will be contending today for the Cinedans Award, a cash prize of 1000, which will be awarded this year for the second time. Members of the audience can cast their own vote for one of the nominated films.

In selecting the films this year, we went even further than last year. We didn't think it enough just to be original, and we concentrated our search more than ever on finding films which showed a symbiosis between dance and camera. Both art forms have their own rules of character and style. The trick in dance films is to show both to their best advantage. In a dance film, the dance is less bound by time and space; it can make leaps, and escape its bounds. There lies the strength of a good dance film, but also the pitfall of a bad one. Because just stringing together an indiscriminate series of beautiful movements is not nearly enough to capture the hearts of the audience. For the many animation films we received, we concentrated on the question: when does the digital world of animation come alive? Too often in animation, the viewer is kept at a distance, so the surprise is even greater if makers of animation films succeed in really bringing the digital world to life.

Judge for yourself today. Besides the nominated films, we are also showing hits like *Damen und Herren ab 65* about the choreography 'Kontakthof' from Pina Bausch. There is a video installation on display, by Susanne Ohmann, Robin Noorda and Ferri Wouters, and the Dutch choreographer Suzy Blok is Artist in Focus with three film showings and an interview. The day is rounded off in style with a party in Café De Balie, where dj's Roberta Marques and Liat Waysbort make sure that everybody takes to the floor.

We hope that everyone really enjoys Cinedans 2004!

Een stel vecht een ruzie uit in hun slaapkamer die langzaam onder water stroomt door een gebarsten waterleiding. Regisseur Reynir Lyngdal, bekend van reclamespotjes en muziekvideo's, gebruikt cartoonachtige opeenvolgingen van scènes en technieken uit vechtsporten. Een spannende choreografie in een strak geregisseerde film die in Toronto de Paula Citron Award voor dansfilm won. (Deze film doet ook mee aan de competitie)

A couple are having a fight in their bedroom, which is slowly flooded by water from a burst water pipe. Director Reynir Lyngdal, known for his TV commercials and music videos, uses cartoon-like sequences of scenes and techniques from the martial arts. An engrossing choreography in a tightly directed film that has won the Paula Citron Award for dance film in Toronto. (This film is also taking part in the competition)


## Urge

Vier dansers, twee klassieke en twee moderne, bevinden zich in één kamer. Ze gaan een dynamische dialoog aan op de klanken van elektronische muziek. De spanning tussen hen ontketent een ongelooflijke energie op het scherm. Urge toont dans voor de camera in een pure en subtiele vorm. (Deze film doet ook mee aan de competitie)

Four dancers, two classical and two modern, are in one room. They enter into a dynamic dialogue to the sounds of electronic music. The tension between them is unleashed in an incredible amount of energy on the screen. Urge shows dance for the camera in a pure and subtle form. (This film is also taking part in the competition)

## Line Dance

Geïnspireerd door een dansavond met zijn vriend Afua Awuku en de dynamische schilderijen van Jackson Pollock, besloot dj Alex Reuben zijn ervaring in het dance-circuit om te zetten in een dansfilm. Met vierenentwintig camera's tegelijk filmde Reuben twee dansende dj's. Uit de beelden ontstond een swingende animatie.

Inspired by a dance evening with his friend Afua Awuku and the action paintings by Jackson Pollock, DJ Alex Reuben decided to transmute his experience in the dance circuit into a dance film. With a battery of twenty-four cameras Reuben filmed two dancing DJs. The images produced a swinging animation.



## When I am Little Again

Videodans, animaties en live performance smelten samen tot een mix van herinnering en verbeelding. Een ode aan de beroemde psycholoog/arts Janusz Koscak, in wiens weeshuis Karen Balsams grootvader opgroeide. De vier generaties van haar familie ontmoeten elkaar als 3D-animatiefiguren in een surreële wereld van familieherinneringen.

Video dance, animations and live performance fuse into a mix of memory and imagination. A tribute to famous psychologist/physician Janusz Korscak, in whose orphanage Karen Balsam's grandfather grew up. The four generations of her family meet as 3D animation figures in a surreal world of family memories.

## Peep Show

Een man en een vrouw betreden samen de absurdistische wereld van een peepshow. Ze krijgen meer dan waar ze op rekenen. Gehuld in strakke pvc-pakken voeren twee dansers een wel heel gewaagd duet uit. 'In vier minuten tijd lukt het deze video sexy, grappig én esthetisch plezierig te zijn', schreef de Toronto Star.

A man and a woman enter the absurdist world of a peep show together. They get far more than they had bargained for. Dressed in body-hugging PVC suits, two dancers perform a truly risqué dance duet. The Toronto Star wrote about this production: 'In four minutes this performance video manages to be sexy, funny and aesthetically pleasing'.

Married for thirty years, a couple wish to have their portrait taken at a photographer's studio. Posing in front of the camera, they reveal their innermost feelings. A tragicomic, intense dance film about facades and the heartrending reality of a relationship.

A super-stylized urban fairytale set against the gritty, dangerous world of underground dance contests. A blistering fusion of Western and Eastern dance and culture, arresting visuals, and a great love story.

## Dancing Las Vegas

Op dansers die in Las Vegas werken wordt vaak neergekeken als eenvoudige 'showgirls', die hun beroep zouden slikken om te kunnen werken en hun rekeningen te betalen. Velen van hen zijn echter goedgetrainde professionals met substantiële dansopleidingen en –carrières. Waarom kiezen wij ervoor in Vegas te werken en verpatsen ze hun integriteit?  
Dancers working in Las Vegas are often looked down as merely 'Showgirls' or as having compromised their profession in order to work and pay the bills. Yet many are well-trained professionals with a substantial dance education and career. Why do they choose to work in Vegas, and are they selling out their integrity?

## Pretty Big Dig

Een dansfilm die aardig de weidse verbreiding van de technologie illustreert.  
A dance film that gently illustrates the assimilation of technology.

Suzy Blok heeft als choreografe de laatste jaren haar sporen ruimschoots verdiend in de Nederlandse dansscene. Haar dansstijl is eigenzinnig, fel en dynamisch. Wat opvalt is de grote poëtische lading en intensiteit in al haar werk. Drie van haar choreografieën heeft ze, in samenwerking met filmregisseurs, bewerkt tot dansfilms. Redenen te over dus om een speciaal programma rond deze choreografe te laten zien. Suzy Blok werkte als danser samen met uiteenlopende choreografen / theatermakers. Vanaf 1986 maakt zij haar eigen choreografieën, waaronder *Still You* (1991). Zij werkte meer dan tien jaar vruchtbare samen met Christopher Steel onder de naam Blok&Steel. Hun werk is zowel in Nederland als in het buitenland succesvol ontvangen. Zij ontvingen diverse prijzen voor hun werk, waaronder de Philip Morris Finest Selection Award, de Prix de Pépinières Européennes pour Jeunes Artistes en de IMZ Dance Screen Award.

In recent years, Suzy Blok has made a name for herself in the Dutch dance scene. Her dance style is original, spirited and dynamic. There is a remarkable poetic quality and intensity in all her work. She has adapted three of her choreographic pieces for film, in collaboration with film directors. Plenty of reasons, therefore, to show a special programme about this choreographer. Suzy Blok worked as a dancer with many different choreographers / theatre makers. From 1986, she started to choreograph works herself, such as *Still You* (1991). For more than ten years, she had a productive collaboration with Christopher Steel, under the name of Blok&Steel. Their work was successfully received in the Netherlands as well as abroad. They were awarded several prizes for their work, including the Philip Morris Finest Selection Award, the Prix de Pépinières Européennes pour Jeunes Artistes and the IMZ Dance Screen Award.



## Still You

The Netherlands, 1993 – 9 min.

De razendsnelle 'pas de deux' in "Still you" speelt zich af aan een lange tafel. Aan weerskanten daarvan zitten twee spelers. Tussen hen in is een theekopje. Dat functioneert als katalysator tussen de twee. Filmregisseuse Mijke de Jong heeft het speelse en vindingrijke in het spel van het duo Gaby Uetz en John Taylor goed weten uit te buiten. 'Still You' won tijdens het IMZ Dance Screen Festival 1994 de eerste prijs in de categorie "Beste Productie voor Camera".

The speedy 'pas de deux' in *Still You* takes place at a long table. At each side there is a performer. Between them is a tea cup which acts as a catalyst. Film director Mijke de Jong has successfully exploited the playful and inventive aspects of the performance by Gaby Uetz and John Taylor. *Still You* won first prize in the category 'Best Production for Camera' in the IMZ Dance Screen Festival 1994.



## Tus Ojos Negros

Een film over herinnering, sfeer en liefde met een centrale plek voor de tango. Mely, een vrouw van rond de tachtig, staat in haar kamer voor een rek met jurken. Op de radio hoort zij een lang vergeten lied. Dat doet de herinnering aan haar jeugd ontwaken... A film about memories, atmosphere and love, with a central role for the tango. Mely, a woman in her eighties, is standing in her room in front of a rack of dresses. She hears a long-forgotten song on the radio which awakens memories of her youth...



## Up at Down

The Netherlands, 2003 – 26 min.

Twee vrouwen en twee mannen zijn in een afgesloten ruimte op elkaar aangewezen. Momenten van eenzaamheid, desillusie, passie, opwinding, intimiteit en bedreiging vormen het vertrekpunt voor de dans en de muziek. Dit soort koersbepalende gebeurtenissen, én de keerpunten die ze teweeg brengen, worden omgezet in de fysieke en theaterale danstaal typerend voor Blok.

De muziek voor *Looking Up At Down* is speciaal gecomponeerd door de Roemeens-Engelse componist en violist Alexander Balanescu. Er wordt gedanst door Kenneth Flak, Kelly Hirina, Eldridge Labinjo en Yukio Tomino.

In 2002, Suzy Blok created the dance performance *Looking Up At Down* in collaboration with composer/musician Alexander Balanescu. The Dutch newspaper NRC Handelsblad declared it the hit of that year's summer festival 'Oerol'. Accompanied by live music on violin, cello and accordion, the performance is set in a locked room where the emotions of four enclosed people flare up high. Co-operating with director Clara van Gool, Blok made an adaptation of the piece for film.

**Coleen Davis** werd geboren in de Verenigde Staten. In de jaren zeventig ontwikkelde zij zich tot Prima Ballerina van Het Nationale Ballet, waar ze tot 2000 danste. Voor haar werk ontving ze vele onderscheidingen. Sinds haar pensioen is ze een hooggewaardeerd lid van verscheidene danscommissies en besturen.

**Tim Persent** werd opgeleid aan de Rambert Ballet School in Londen en danste jarenlang bij De Rotterdamse Dansgroep. Tevens werkte hij met de choreografen Krisztina de Châtel, Paul Selwyn Norton, Samuel Würsten, Johan Greben, Ton Simons, Brenda Daniels, Michael Schumacher en Roland Shankula. Hij is vaste danser bij Leine & Roebana. In 1993 won hij de Zilveren Theaterdansprijs.

**John Appel** werkt sinds zijn afstuderen aan de Filmacademie in 1987 als zelfstandig documentairemaker en cameraman. Hij maakte ruim dertig documentaires, waaronder drie voor de bioscoop. In 1999 won hij de Joris Ivens Award op het IDFA voor de film André Hazes/ Zij gelooft in mij. Op het Infinity Filmfestival in Italië won hij onlangs de prijs voor de beste regie voor de film The Last Victory (in augustus 2004 te zien in de bioscoop). Appel is gastdocent op o.a. de Filmacademie en de Media-academie, was adviseur bij het Filmfonds en Stifo, en was tevens jurylid van de Joris Ivens Competitie op het IDFA 2000.

**Mart Dominicus** is filmmaker. Hij regisseerde onder andere de twee dansfilms P en Blindside Block. Daarnaast is hij recensent en is hij als artistiek adviseur verbonden aan het Nederlands Fonds voor de Film.

### **And the winner is...**

This year, a hundred and twenty films from twenty countries arrived on Cinedans's doorstep. From this enormously increased number of films, the organization selected the best twenty-five and these will all be shown during the festival, in either the big or the small auditorium of De Balie. A jury of experts, made up of dancers Coleen Davis and Tim Persent and filmmakers John Appel and Mart Dominicus, put together a shortlist from these twenty-five films which will contend for the Cinedans Award 2004. Eight dance films made it through their strict selection process. It is up to you to decide who the winner will be. Following the showing of all the nominations, you can cast your vote in the big auditorium.

### **Introducing: the jury members**

**Coleen Davis** was born in the USA. She danced with Het Nationale Ballet from 1977-2000, where she became a prima ballerina. During her career she received many awards and since retiring she has been a highly-regarded member of various dance committees and boards. Coleen is married with three children.

**Tim Persent** trained with the Rambert Ballet School in London and danced for many years with De Rotterdamse Dansgroep. He has also worked with Krisztina de Châtel, Paul Selwyn Norton, Samuel Würsten, Johan Greben, Ton Simons, Brenda Daniels, Michael Schumacher and Roland Shankula. He is a regular dancer with Leine & Roebana. In 1993, he was awarded the Zilveren Theaterdansprijs.

**John Appel** has been working as a freelance documentary maker and cameraman since he graduated from the Filmacademie in 1987. He has made over 30 documentaries, including 3 for the cinema. In 1999, he won the Joris Ivens Award, at the IDFA, for the film 'André Hazes/ Zij gelooft in mij'. Recently, he won the prize for best director, at the Infinity Film Festival in Italy, for the film 'The last victory' (in the cinema in August 2004).

He is a guest teacher at the Filmacademie and the Media-academie, an ex-adviser for Filmfonds and Stifo, and was a jury member for the Joris Ivens Competition at the IDFA 2000.

**Mart Dominicus** is a filmmaker. Among other films, he directed the two dance films P and Blindside Block. He is also a critic, and artistic adviser with the Nederlands Fonds voor de Film/Dutch Filmfund.

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### Moving North

'A Serie of Short Dance Films' is een uniek Noordelijk project met als doel de talenten van Noordelijke choreografen en filmmakers uit Denemarken, Noorwegen, Zweden, Finland en IJsland samen te brengen. ### Moving North

A Series of Short Dance Films is a unique Nordic project which aims to combine the talents of Nordic choreographers and film makers from Denmark, Norway, Sweden, Finland and Iceland. They have explored movement and space through the camera's viewfinder and created original dance films, each lasting 5 minutes and specially made for live images. Norwegian organiser Magne Antonsen initiated this project with Danish producer Vibeke Vogel. 'Urge' (Denmark), 'Portrait' (Finland) and 'Burst' (Iceland) are nominated for the Cinedans Audience Award.

### Interactive Dance Film

5-day workshop at Cinedans

Cinedans en Mediamic organiseren van 4 tot 8 juli een workshop over interactieve dansfilm,

Zo'n zestien internationale dansfilmmakers, producenten en choreografen maken in een vijfdaagse workshop een interactieve dansfilm met hun eigen, eerdere materiaal als uitgangspunt. De workshop neemt de snelheid aan van een snelkookpan; in een intens proces leren belangstellenden de mogelijkheden kennen van de interactieve film. Ze ontwerpen hun eigen project, dat ze bespreken met vakgenoten en ervaren docenten. Zo bouwen ze aan hun eigen werkmethode.

De combinatie van film met interactieve media biedt alternatieve manieren om verhalen te vertellen en te ervaren. De deelnemers ontdekken mogelijke relaties tussen de keuzes van een gebruiker en aspecten als camerabeweging, beeld, choreografie, timing en dramaturgie.

Deelnemers mogen zelf maximaal veertig minuten film meenemen. Om hun interactieve verhalen te maken, gebruiken ze het slimme en eenvoudig te leren Korsakow System. ### Interactive Dance Film

5-day workshop at Cinedans

Cinedans and Mediamic are organising a workshop on interactive dance film from 4 - 8 July 2004.

Up to 16 international dance filmmakers, editors and choreographers use their own footage to make an interactive dance film in a 5-day workshop. The workshop is an intense, pressure-cooker-style process, in which they get to know the possibilities of interactive film, design their own project, discuss it with peers and experienced trainers and build their own working prototype. The combination of film with interactive media offers alternative ways to tell and experience stories. The participants explore possible relationships between the choices of a user and aspects like camera movement, image, choreography, timing and dramaturgy.

Participants can bring a maximum of 40 minutes of footage per person. To make their interactive stories, they use the elegant and easy-to-learn Korsakow System. Korsakow projects can be published on and off-line. All participants receive personal assistance in realising their workshop projects. No technical knowledge of new media is required.

'Hullabaloo' is één installatie uit drie die tentoongesteld werd in de videogalerie Montevideo/Time Based Arts in maart 2003.

A woman playfully explores her dual nature by becoming a horse in her imagination. Meanwhile she encounters a real horse. They recognize and imitate each other.

Susanne Ohmann (Amsterdam-based German dancer/performance artist), Robin Noorda (art director/ animator) and Ferri Wouters (graphic designer/media artist) have collaborated to create a number of works including "Tussled By Tailwinds", a web site for the NPS Webd@nce project and "Head Or Tail?", a short film that received a nomination in the Sandberg Institute's "One Minute Award 2001". These, as well as the present video installation "Hullabaloo", are based on movement sequences which reflect on the theme of duality within the human psyche.

"Hullabaloo" includes a video fragment of an encounter between Susanne and a horse named Trenta. It was filmed during a "horse whispering" session with Johan Miessen in Limburg (filmed by Hans Rozinga).

"Hullabaloo" is one installation of three that was exhibited at video gallery Montevideo/Time Based Arts in March 2003.

The eye of the camera underlines at the same time the coercive character as well as the subtle emotional accents of the architectural choreography. The personality of the dancers break through this construction continuously. The various casts that have been dancing this piece, illustrate in this film the evolution of the interpretations of the choreography.
